1.1 Internship type: Academic internship (pedagogical) (hereafter – internship).

1.2 Mean of conducting: university base.

2. GOALS AND OBJECTIVES OF THE INTERNSHIP

The goal of the internship is to develop professional competence in teaching.

The objectives of the internship are:

1) to practice implementation of traditional and modern teaching English language methods;

2) to develop the skill of applying modern educational technologies for teaching the English language;

3) to develop the skill of students' knowledge assessment by using tests and other controlling methods in accordance with their real capabilities.

Academic internship is an integral part of the curriculum in the field of study 45.04.02 Linguistics and is compiled by the participants of the educational process. To do Academic internship successfully, students have to study interconnected courses: Information technologies in professional activity, Elementary pedagogy and psychology, English for specific purposes, Modern educational technologies in teaching English, Testing and assessment.

5. TIME AND PLACE OF THE INTERNSHIP

Academic internship (pedagogical) is done by the students of the second year of studying (semester 4). The internship is done at the Department of Translation and Intercultural Communication of the School of International Relations of the Amur State University.

6. INTERNSHIP VALUE IN CREDIT POINTS AND DURATION IN WEEKS

Academic internship value and duration are defined by the curriculum in the field of study 45.04.02 Linguistics.

Academic internship value is 9 credit points. The duration of the internship is 6 weeks.

7. INTERNSHIP ARRANGEMENT

Possible individual assignment

for a student doing academic internship

1. Visit 5 English language classes taught by the faculty of the Department.

2. Make the pedagogical analysis of each class. Cover educational focus and specific characteristics of the educational institution, didactic design of the lesson, pedagogical background of the lesson (approaches, methods, techniques used).

3. Plan and write a synopsis of an English language class. Choose a method (methods) that is applicable to the learners and teaching objectives. Use different educational techniques.

4. Complete and submit your academic internship report.

8. EDUCATIONAL, RESEARCH AND PRODUCTION TECHNOLOGIES USED AT THE INTERNSHIP

Academic internship (pedagogical) involves educational, research and production technologies that enable teaching:

- study and systematization of professional, scientific references and documents with the use of open Internet resources and on-line libraries;

- information communication technologies (ICT) enable search for necessary information and creation of teaching aids (presentations, tests, other educational assignments) to supply and elaborate the class synopsis.

9. INTERNSHIP REPORT

Intermediate certification of students' progress is carried out via examination. The grade is defined by the internship tutor after examining a student's report. The latter includes:

1) academic internship report (cover sheet, individual assignment, reference paper (table of contents, introduction, main part, conclusion, reference list, appendices));

2) completed internship record book attested by the internship tutor;

3) written pedagogical analysis of the classes attended;

4) a synopsis of an English language lesson.

All papers should be submitted within the time-frame scheduled.

10. ASSESSMENT TOOLS FOR INTERMEDIATE CERTIFICATION OF ACADEMIC INTERNSHIP

Assessment tools for intermediate certification of academic internship are the subject of the assessment tools fund. Competence formation testing and assessment include continuous assessment and intermediate certification.

Continuous assessment is carried out at the consultations scheduled in the individual assignment of the student.

Intermediate certification is carried out at the exam where students' performance is assessed by 1) the internship report; 2) oral presentation on a topic related.

Students who do not do academic internship within the time prescribed by the syllabus for a good reason can have it rescheduled by the rector's order. Students who do not do academic internship within the time prescribed by the syllabus without a good reason are expelled from the University for academic underachievement in a manner prescribed by the Statute of AmSU and the existing regulation of academic internship.
